Beginner Cube

If you want to get into speedcubing, you should start by getting a good beginner puzzle. Most of these are under \$20:

- Moyu RS3M 2020 3x3
- YuXin Little Magic 3x3
- Qiyi Warrior W 3X3

For a little more money, you might consider a smart cube. These puzzles offer tutorials, allow you to race online with other cubers, and track your solve times.

Learn about centers, opposite facing colors, edge pieces, corners, rotation.

Beginner Solve Guides

Choose your own adventure. There are many beginner solve guides; they're all fairly similar. Basic rule of thumb for beginners' methods: solve <u>layer by layer</u> and not face by face.

A simple method that doesn't require learning notation or fancy algorithms. Try not to get discouraged! Many of us watched and re-watched this video hundreds of times. Once you master this, you can move on to more complicated algorithms and finger tricks.





Speedcubing

Once you have mastered the beginner's method, there are a few ways to get faster. You can 1) get faster/smoother with your finger tricks, 2) get more efficient with your turns with algorithms, 3) practice, practice, and more practice.

Cubing Notation




In order to read algorithm tutorials, you'll need to learn cubing notation. There are 6 letters to represent the faces of the cube. There are even more advanced rotations for speedcubing.






CONS

 - Generation 3 Pro Timer, Generation 4 Pro Timer, or Generation 5 Pro Timer





First Comp Tips:

- Before the comp:
 - Get a good night's sleep. Competition day is a LONG day!
 - Make sure your cubes are set up before the comp. You might bring a spare in case something happens to your main.
 - Familiarize yourself with <u>judging</u>. You will be expected to help with judging during the comp. Don't sweat it. It's fairly easy. You'll be shown how. You might also be asked to be a runner or scrambler.
 - Familiarize yourself with the competition environment: using a cube cover, inspection, using a Stackmat timer, scorecard (DNF, +2), types of cubes allowed/regulations.

 - If the venue allows it, pack snacks/drinks.
 - If you practice with ear plugs, pack those.
- Day of the comp:
 - Arrive early, register on time, get your schedule. Pay attention to when you'll be solving or judging. Find a practice table.
 - If it's your first comp, be sure to attend the tutorial at the beginning.
 - Keep track of your cubes. Know how many you brought. If the center cap comes off, consider putting your name there. A lot of cubes look alike. It's not uncommon for them to get mixed up or go missing.
 - Talk to other cubers in the community. Everyone is welcoming and friendly, even the "famous" cubers.
 - Meet the organizers and delegates. They're approachable and open to any
 questions that you might have. Be sure to thank your delegate. It takes a lot
 of work to organize a comp.

- Keep calm and cube on. It's common to do a little worse in comp than at home.
- Relax and have fun.
